Hi! Welcome to the National Museum of Ireland.

When people think of Ireland in the past they think of men in the fields looking after the animals and working long hours to grow potatoes and other vegetables. But most work was in the home, and here it was the women who did everything. Women worked from early in the morning until late at night and for many it was a very difficult life. It was possible to hear Irish women say,

"A man's work is from sun to sun but a woman's work is never done".

Task 2- Check your answers


